

Assume: Negative Income Tax model


\$20K per adult per year adjusted for family size with 30% reduction rate

Boadway, Cuff, Koebel Two-Stage model 2016:

- 1. Federal government replaces current refundable and nonrefundable tax credits with income-tested BI;
- 2. Provinces decide to harmonize or adjust province-specific levels / transfers
- >> Social services intact




